Dear Friend



Our Youth Groups

1. Wildfire

Wildfire meets on Tuesday evenings at St Martin's in term time from 7.30-9pm. This group is a youth group for Yrs. 7-11. There are about 20 teens at each session and 4 leaders.

2. Fuel

Fuel meets on Thursday evenings in term time at St Boniface from 7.30-9pm. This is a discipleship group for Yrs.9-13. It is about to start up again with around 6 teenagers. The group has three leaders at present.



3. Focus

Focus meets at St Boniface as part of the 4pm service. This teaching group for Yrs. 7-11 has around 9 attendees and three leaders.



Prior to the pandemic, we had just launched a homework Café at St Martin's. This has yet to be re-started. A grant was obtained to start the Café and we have leaders who will help.

Other Information

The parish has a track record of our young people going to a summer Christian festival. Recently, this has not been possible in person with the pandemic, but we hope that it might be possible to attend Limitless Festival this year.

We have two secondary schools in the parish and before the pandemic had classes into St Boniface for RS teaching. We hope to re-establish relationships and develop further ties with these schools.



4pm Service

This service is a contemporary worship service, with Bible teaching and children and youth ministry. A 4pm co-ordinating team support the service, organising bands, intercessions,

welcome, AV etc. and team members meet several times a year. The new Youth Minister will join this team and will also closely work with Ian in joint oversight, developing this service. We have a small number of people who lead and preach in the service, including Penny and Hayley. At present, there are around 35 adults and 25 young people/children attending the service each week. Also, we have a number of homegroups associated with this service. We



seek to be 'light in our community' and as the pandemic recedes, we will be seeking to discern and develop a local mission focus.

Una Barter



The Parish

The parish is a large suburban parish of c.24,000. We have two churches, St Boniface (built 1904) on Hursley Road and St Martin in the Wood (built 1960) on Queens Road, which are about 1.5 miles apart. Both churches have been extended to provide additional halls and meeting room space and have excellent facilities.

Our electoral roll is 317. We are churches with welcoming and friendly congregations. There is a close, supportive and very effective parish leadership team, and the parish is richly blessed by having many gifted volunteers who use their gifts and time to contribute to its life and mission. The clergy and leadership team meet regularly for discussion, planning and prayer.
